

# Bob's leaving gift, card and message

# Letter from Norman Whyte PCC Treasurer for All Saints Church PARISH GIVING SCHEME (PGS)

Many of you will know that your PCC agreed to join the Parish Giving Scheme which is run by The Diocese of Gloucester on behalf of The Church of England and is a registered charity

The scheme is open to anyone who wishes to make a regular donation to our church and many of our regular givers have already signed up to it and the payment from your account comes out by Direct Debit

It also gives the opportunity to have your regular gift inflation linked rather than having to review it yourself which of course you can still do

The main benefit to our church is that it has given everyone joining the chance to review their giving and to Gift Aid your contribution so we get 25% extra from HMRC

It reduces the amount of administration for us and PGS has agreed with HMRC to have the Gift Aid paid each month rather than having to wait until the end of the tax year and claim periods

Those who have signed up should have received an acknowledgment from the office of the PGS thanking them for joining the scheme and reminding them to cancel their standing order if that is how they pay after the last payment has gone out of your bank – most of those who have joined have put a start date of 1<sup>st</sup> March when the first Direct Debit will be taken out so please cancel your standing order after the February payment has been made

To date 26 regular givers have signed up to PGS and I'm pleased to report that a significant increase in giving is already showing

If you would like to join the scheme let me know and I'll deliver or post a form to you

There is no compulsion on anyone to join and if you wish to continue the way you support our church we remain ever grateful

Rectors letter Dear all

This Tuesday is Shrove Tuesday – Happy Mardi Gras, everyone!

In a normal year Scholes church would be winding up to run their annual Pancake Party extravaganza on Tuesday, and on Wednesday I would be going into school to talk about Ash Wednesday. Each year I offer the 'imposition of ashes' on the heads of any children who want it (although I do wonder how much they understand it, especially when one reception child asked 'Can I have a tattoo too, please?').

The Ash Wednesday services in Barwick and Thorner are always powerful moments, when we come and recognise both our sinfulness and God's great mercy and forgiveness. Placing ash on each communicant's heads with the words:

'Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ. Repent and believe the Good News.'

Such powerful words that speak of the human condition and God's grace.

Obviously, this Wednesday we cannot meet in church and I cannot touch people on their foreheads, as I would love to do.

Instead, there will be a Zoom service using the Ash Wednesday liturgy that is attached with this letter. If anyone would like to have a 'do-it-yourself' ashing kit, I will gladly come to people's doors with a small packet of ash for use during the service.
