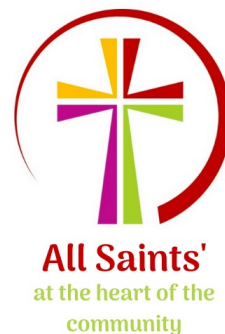

To join the service

Dial in using the appropriate number

from a Landline: 0844 4 73 73 73

from a UK Mobile: 8 73 73

When asked, enter the group PIN 716 416.

You'll be asked to record your name and then the conference call can begin.

The phone calls last around 20 – 30 minutes on a Sunday and 15 minutes on a Wednesday.

The call costs

5.8p/min from a landline +VAT and your phone company's access charge.

12.5p/min from a mobile +VAT. If you are unable to call this number and are using an O2 mobile, please dial 98 73 73 instead.

We estimate the cost will be just over £2 on Sunday and £1 on Wednesday.

Please check with your phone provider for their additional charges.

Coronavirus support in Barwick-in-Elmet. An informal group linking volunteers and local agencies with those in need, especially the Elderly and those at risk of the Coronavirus.
