Finding Jesus on the road

I finally gave in this week! Jess shaved my head to a number 6. Not out of penance (the wrong season) but out of desperation. Few of you will recognise me now. It is yet another reason for not being seen in public alongside having poorly children and not wanting to venture out much. With this self-isolation, like many of us, there has come an extra special joy in seeing a friendly face or hearing a familiar voice. People have been so kind delivering food or checking how we are through the inter-web-thingy. Reflecting on Sunday's Gospel reading, it is the last line that stuck in my throat; "He had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread." I have really missed Holy Communion and gathering together.

So far, I have shied away from taking Communion at home. Instead I am looking for Jesus in new places and new people. My expectation of what he looks like in the current situation is being challenged. It is being 'out on the road' rather than in a church, even if that road is the internet, the careful avoiding of people out on the continued overleaf

street or a telephone call.

Many of us are having to be cared for by others when we are used to freedom and independence. In doing so we are allowing Jesus to serve us, to break bread for us. Sometimes I have found this like a friendly face or familiar voice knocking on the door with a food parcel or calling to see how I am. It can be especially true for those putting themselves in harms way, whether by working in hospital, behind the checkout in a shop or all the other essential parts of life which cannot stop. Somehow we mysteriously manifest the risen life of Christ in our service to one another. God becomes present in our kind words and actions, even through what looks like inaction, the staying inside to protect ourselves and others. So both as those being served for and those serving, my prayer for us all is that of the Collect for this Sunday; "Give us such knowledge of his presence with us, that we may be strengthened and sustained by his risen life"; whether that is on the road or in solitude. **Bob**
