Letter from Andy

Harvest is one of those times of the year that have both a 'community' and a 'religious' aspect to it, though in truth the two intermingle in so many ways they become almost indistinguishable.

As a community surrounded by fields and farms it is a celebration of the importance of farming to our lives, an aspect of modern life often hidden in the background behind cellophane wrapped chicken and broccoli. Harvest reminds us of where that chicken and broccoli come from, and it's not 'Tesco' as one inner city child answered to that question.

The more 'religious' aspect of harvest reminds us that Christ's call is for Christians to be involved in the growth of spirituality and that in sharing the Gospel we are responding to Jesus' statement that 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few'.

If we over spiritualise the meaning of Harvest it becomes about nothing more than spreading the message, and if we lose the spiritual aspect it becomes a Primary School lesson on where our food comes from.

When the two are combined it becomes a multi-facetted celebrations of God's gifts in nature and ourselves as well as challenging us to share God's message of love through word and generosity. That generosity pushes us to donate food to particular charities, and this harvest we are collecting for St George's Crypt, which celebrates its 90th anniversary on 14th October.

The work of the Crypt epitomizes the synergy of message through word and action, sharing the message of Good News with the clients, while at the same time caring for their needs.

In the midst of this pandemic, where it is easy to become introverted and think only of our own isolation and concerns, it is a useful corrective to remind ourselves of the generosity of God and reflect that generosity in our own lives.

Finally, this Sunday will be the last pre-recorded Youtube Service for a while (though they won't completely disappear from your screens as Remembrance will be pre-recorded and some Christmas services will also be done this way). From the 11th October Bob will be putting up one of the services from the churches of the benefice onto livestream.
