Andy's Letter 20/02/2021

Dear All,

Mark's Gospel is the shortest and punchiest of the four, and nowhere more so than in the passage read this Sunday. In six short verses Mark whisks us through three events that other writers spend whole chapters on. Jesus is baptised, he is tempted in the wilderness and he begins his ministry with the words 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

It seems only yesterday that I was welcoming Bob to the benefice, but it was actually nearly four years ago. In that short time he has, with his infectious enthusiasm and gentle love, made a great difference across the three churches, but most particularly in Barwick.

Tomorrow we say goodbye to Bob and his family and catapult him into a new ministry in Kippax, Swillington and Allerton Bywater. Like Jesus at the beginning of his ministry, the time here has been fulfilled, and through Bob's ministry the kingdom of God has come near.

The word *repent* literally means 'to turn again', to make a new start, and that is what both Bob and the benefice are doing tomorrow, making a new start, but most important is the final phrase, that we must believe in the Good News.

The Gospel, or Good News, is found in brief in the two preceding events. In Jesus' baptism, God the Father reminds us of the connection between him and Jesus – 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased' – and the Christian message is based both on Jesus being the only begotten Son of God, but also that through Jesus we are all equally loved and cared for as children of the same heavenly Father.
