Letter from the Rector

Saturday 8 May 2021

Dear all

Tomorrow's Gospel continues last week's passage and develops it. Last week, Jesus spoke of being the True Vine, with us as the branches and the Father the vine grower. Central to that passage was abiding in Jesus, as he abides in us.

Tomorrow's passage develops this from a personal love for Jesus to a communal love for one another: 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.'

This command tells us both what to do – love one another – and how to do it – as I have loved you. The love we are to show one another is not some ephemeral, ambiguous love that can be interpreted in whatever way the listener chooses. It is grounded in the life and service of Jesus' ministry on earth; it is seen in his reaching out to the marginalised and hurting; it is seen in his attitude to women and children; it is seen in his washing of his disciples' feet; and, most starkly, it is seen in his dying on the cross to save us from our own corruption.

Jesus' leadership is a compassionate and servant leadership that challenges us all, and particularly those of us in leadership positions, to repeatedly assess our motives, actions and decisions and compare them to Jesus'. To love one another as Jesus has loved us sounds such an easy task, but it is the work of a lifetime to put it into practice.

But, of course, Jesus' words aren't just for leaders but for all of us. Jesus goes on to say that we are no longer servants but have become his friends. That bond of friendship reaches out from Jesus and impacts on the whole Church and through the Church, the world.

St Augustine in his *Confession* said that 'The friendship which draws human beings together in a tender bond is sweet to us because out of many minds it forges a unity.' As friends of Jesus, the more we spend time with him and others of his friends, the more that bond will forge a unity. This is something we have sorely missed in the past 12 months and are now beginning to

rekindle. As we come out of lockdown, I pray that more and more we will let the love of friendship and the love of Jesus develop in our community of three churches that we may forge a unity within the differences, and a purpose of love in all we do.

When we do this, the fruit of the spirit will blossom and show to the people across our villages and they will know that we are disciples of Jesus, because we love one another.
